

FRAUD ALERT

It has come to our attention that fraudulent emails are being sent out which appear to be from Lamar Advertising. These emails most often offer a job or an opportunity to work from home, and ask the recipient to open a bank account or help move money from account to account. The emails look like they are from Lamar Advertising, but in fact are “spoofed” or faked to look like they came from Lamar. The emails often have a link to a web site which is spoofed or faked to look exactly like Lamar Advertising’s official web site. The purpose of these fraudulent emails is to get recipients to disclose personal information in order for the spammers to commit identity theft.

Lamar Advertising never sends any such spam emails and is not affiliated in any way with the persons responsible for sending these spam emails.
